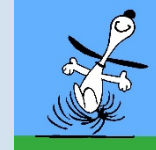

Details:

- Generators AND Receiving Facilities
- Do not send copies to DEEP
 - ✗ No pages or copies from the manifest form
 - ✗ No photocopies of any part of the manifest
 - ✗ Not for RCRA hazardous waste
 - ✗ Not for PCBs (TSCA and CT-Regulated Waste (CR01)
 - ✗ Not CT-Regulated Waste (“CR0X codes”)
 - ✗ Bills of Lading
 - ✓ **Exception: unresolved discrepancy reports**



Electronic Recordkeeping

No paper manifest records needed at your facility

- * If you can access E-Manifest system at your facility
- * for manifests dated 6-30-18 and thereafter

Details for e-recordkeeping:

- ❖ Your facility needs an EPA ID number
- ❖ Facility staff are:
 - o registered in RCRAInfo and
 - o have permissions approved for your facility
- ❖ Facility has computer / device(s) capable of accessing RCRAInfo



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DEEP Recommends:

All Generators should consider registering

- Correct mistakes that can trigger other requirements
 - (e.g. CT Property Transfer Program)
- View and track manifest real time, 24/7/365 from anywhere
- “myRCRAid”: make changes to site info on line
- Not registered means:
 - Can’t make corrections or use myRCRAid
 - Cannot see the manifest until it is published 90+ days later
 - Higher costs may be passed on to generator for using paper manifest

Register a “Site Manager” now

- E-Manifest will connect to Site Managers automatically 6-30-18
- Site Managers then approve others for your facility 24/7/365/anywhere:
 - Facility staff, transporters, brokers, etc.



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Next Steps:

- DEEP is developing policies to document these considerations prior to e-Manifest launch
 - o No copies required to be submitted 
 - o E-recordkeeping
- DEEP will later adopt E-Manifest rules and make associated changes in CT regulations
